*Every Thing On It*, Shel Silverstein



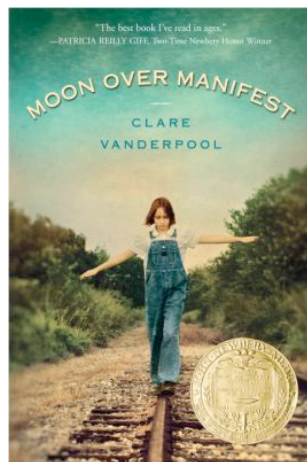
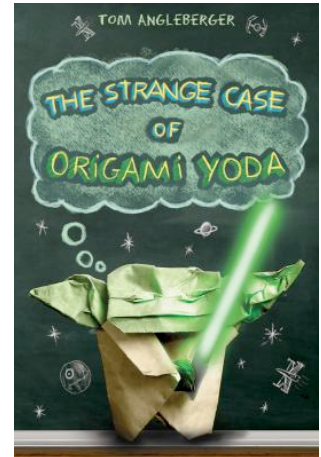
This 2011 publication is full of never before published poems and drawings by the beloved late poet and illustrator, Shel Silverstein. Here's a part of the title poem:

This Depression-Era historical fiction novel tells the story of a twelve-year old girl who is sent to her dad's hometown in Kansas for the summer of 1936. While there, she tries to find out some answers to the questions she has about his somewhat mysterious past. This book won the American Library Association's John Newbery Medal for the most distinguished contribution to American literature for children in 2011.
